The title and the list of author's must be placed between the brackets { } after the command \newtitle or \newauthor, respectively. For long title and long list, use \\ to demand line breaking followed by \medskip to have a suitable skip. The author who will actually give the talk is marked by an underline (\underbar{ }). The upper index after every author's name made by a number in the brackets { } after the command \no following the name is to indicate the corresponding address in the list at the end. To make this list, you have to use the command \newaddress{ } and the environment itemize with \no{ } in the bracket of \item[ ]. For instance, the list of addresses at the end of this text is written by
